

At this meeting, we will focus our thoughts on the topic of **Peace and Violence/War**. We live in a world of more and more violence and wars. How can we deal with the war in Urkain? What can we do for the people in Palestine? What do I feel when I am facing violence either from criminals or soldiers or others?



One of our ancestors, Johann Amos Comenius, also lived in violentful times. But he always longed for peace. In one of his books (Orbis sensualium pictus — the visible World) he wrote at the beginning as a summery of his theology, pedagogy and philosophy:

Omnia sponte fluant – absit violentia rebus Let everything flow of its own accord – let there be no violence in things

The following questions are offered for reflection in the small group. Identify a facilitator in your group who will also report to the total group:

- 1) Do you have any personal experience with dangerous and violentful situations? Have you been in war situations (also civil war)? Have you been threatened by criminals or others? Are there other situation you faced violence?
- 2) What is your opinion about war and peace? Can war be justified? How can I/we react when we are threatened?
- 3) What tells the bible about peace and war? Which verses are important for you?
- 4) Sometimes God fights for his people and destroys the enemies Is this a justified war?
- 5) Comenius said: no violence in all things. Could this be reality? Is this peace?
- 6) What can we do for a world without violence?

Please share this invitation with anyone who might have an interest in this conversation. We will be together for approximately ninety minutes.
